Based on input from the two calls, three cross-constituency sub-committees will be formed to address

	 Clearly documenting the regulatory status of hand hygiene products. Investigating behavioral aspects and the potential public health benefit of changes to the food code.
	 Scientific review of the literature and data related to effectiveness and risk reduction of hand hygiene regimes.
