The Assembly of State Delegates at its meeting in Richmond, Virginia extracted Issue 2018-I-027 – "Amend Food Code – Obtaining Purchase Information during Outbreak Investigations" and rejected the Council's recommendation for "No Action" on the Issue. As required by the CFP's *Biennial Meeting/Conference Procedures Manual*, this Issue was referred to the Executive Board for further consideration. The Executive Board elected to form an ad hoc committee to further deliberate the Issue and provide a final recommendation at the August 2018 meeting of the Executive Board.

As directed, the ad hoc committee presented a report to the Board that summarized its activities and offered recommendations about the Issue. Following a discussion of the committee's report and recommendation, a motion was passed by the Board that recommended sending a letter to FDA asking the agency to work with CDC, USDA-FSIS and CIFOR to explore the science, privacy issues and potential opportunities for including provisions in a future edition of the Food Code related to obtaining purchase information from various sources for case-patient customers to be used by agencies during the investigation of foodborne illness outbreaks.

COMMITTEE WORK PLAN AND TIMELINE:

FDA, CDC, USDA-FSIS and CIFOR work together to explore the science, privacy issues and potential opportunities for including provisions in a future edition of the Food Code related to obtaining purchase information from various sources for case-patient customers to be used by agencies during the investigation of foodborne illness outbreaks.

- The Committee is asking the Board for the Issue to stay and be decided by the EB to insert draft language directly into the Supplement to the 2017 Food Code, pending timing of its release, or in the next full edition of the Food Code in 2021. The sample draft language is attached and the committee would work with FDA, as needed, for input in developing final language to align with Code convention and placement.
- 2. The Committee is asking the Board to approve the development of a Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) document to address stakeholder questions about consumer shopper information as a tool in foodborne illness investigation.
